NEW HOURS – All exhibits must be dropped off by 11:00 AM, Friday of the Fair. Thursday – the building is open from 1 pm – 9 pm to accept exhibits. All exhibits must remain on display until Sunday. **Pick up for items now on Monday from 6 pm – 8 pm.** This is for the safety of our patrons and accessibility to pick up your items. Prize money can be picked up in the office on Sunday during the day. Judging is carried out according to “Ontario Judging and Exhibiting Standards.” Copies are available from the Ontario Horticulture Association. See Tips.

- Water well the night before you cut the flower.
- Cut in the morning, 2 days before you need it (Example - *Wednesday before the Fair*)
- Fill the container with water right up to the base of the flower and store in a cool, dark place. If you use half water and half 7-up, this will help keep them for a longer period.
- Choose a container to enhance the flower specimen, even though the container itself is not judged.
- Only display the number of blooms requested.
- Entries should include foliage attached.
- A spray is one stem with flowering growth.
- No use of artificial material unless called for in section.
- Flowers of the same size, variety and colour score higher points.

Rules:

1. Supply own containers for all flowers including Rose Show.
2. Check all tickets for name and number- fasten securely.
3. Membership fee not retained from prize money. Membership fee to be paid before entries accepted.
4. Entry forms must be left with fair secretary prior to placing exhibits in the exhibit hall.
5. No entry form – no prize money.
6. First place automatically receives “special.”
7. Any bud showing colour counts as a bloom.

1. Dahlias, 1 bloom – 6” – 10.”
2. Dahlias, small, 5 blooms
3. Aster, 5 stems
4. Marigolds, French, 5 blooms
5. Marigolds, African, 5 blooms
6. Snapdragons, 3 spikes, any colour
7. Cosmos, 5 blooms
8. Gladiolas, 3 spikes
9. Hydrangea, 1 fresh bloom
10. Salvia, 3 stems, any colour
11. Geranium, 1 cut bloom, any colour with own foliage.
12. Zinnias, 3 stems under 2 inches,
flower same colour and variety
13. Zinnias, 3 stems over 2-inch flower
14. Any other annual not mentioned above, 3 stems.
15. Coneflower, 3 stems
16. Flowering houseplant, in pot, no larger than 12” across
17. Sunflowers, 3 stems, decorative, any colour, not grown for birdseed.
18. One Cactus plant
19. Flowering Sedum, at least 3 varieties
20. Collection of Hosta Leaves
